- A rhymed poem


MY POEM WILL FOLLOW:

POETRY TIPS

WHAT IS A HAIKU?

A haiku is a poem that has three lines. The first line has five syllables. The second line has seven syllables. The third line has five syllables.

WHAT IS A LIMERICK?

A limerick is a funny poem that has five lines. The first, second and fifth line rhyme with each other. The third and fourth lines rhyme with each other.



WHAT IS A RHYMED POEM?

A rhymed poem can have any structure you like, be as long as you like and can rhyme in any way you like.
