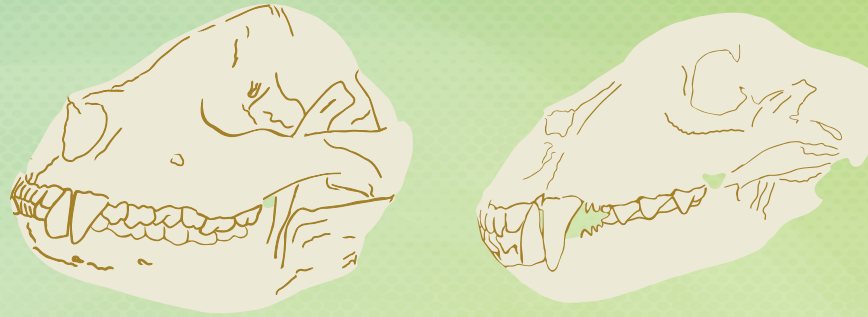


Both the giant panda and the Asian black bear have similar **incisors** (biting teeth) and **canines** (killing teeth) but look closely at the **molars** (back teeth).



Which skull has **chewing** back teeth? [large flat teeth to help grind & chew]

Which skull has **slicing** back teeth? [sharp teeth that slice past each other]

Which type of back teeth do you think the **giant panda** needs?

Which type of back teeth do you think the **Asian black bear** needs?

Which skull belongs to the **giant panda**?

Notes:

- The Mandarin word for human teeth is usually 牙齿 yáchǐ. Incisor tooth 切牙 qiēyá; canine tooth 尖牙 jiānyá; molar tooth 磨牙 móyá.
- The Asian black bear is also known as the moon bear.
