
Both the giant panda and the Asian black bear have similar **incisors** (biting teeth) and **canines** (killing teeth) but look closely at the **molars** (back teeth).

[sharp teeth that slice past each other] Which type of back teeth do you think the **giant panda** needs? Which type of back teeth do you think the **Asian black bear** needs? Which skull belongs to the **giant panda**?

Notes:

• The Mandarin word for human teeth is usually 牙齿 yáchǐ. Incisor tooth 切牙qiēyá; canine tooth 尖牙jiānyá; molar tooth 磨牙móyá.

• The Asian black bear is also known as the moon bear.
