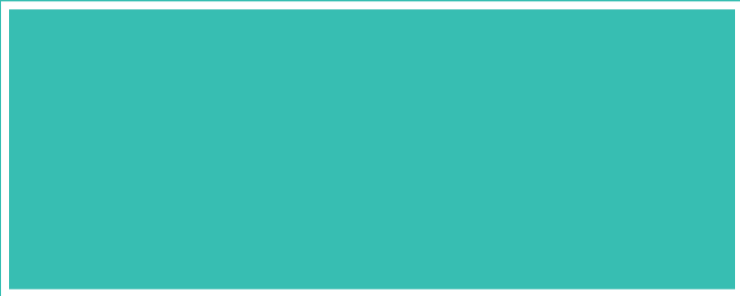
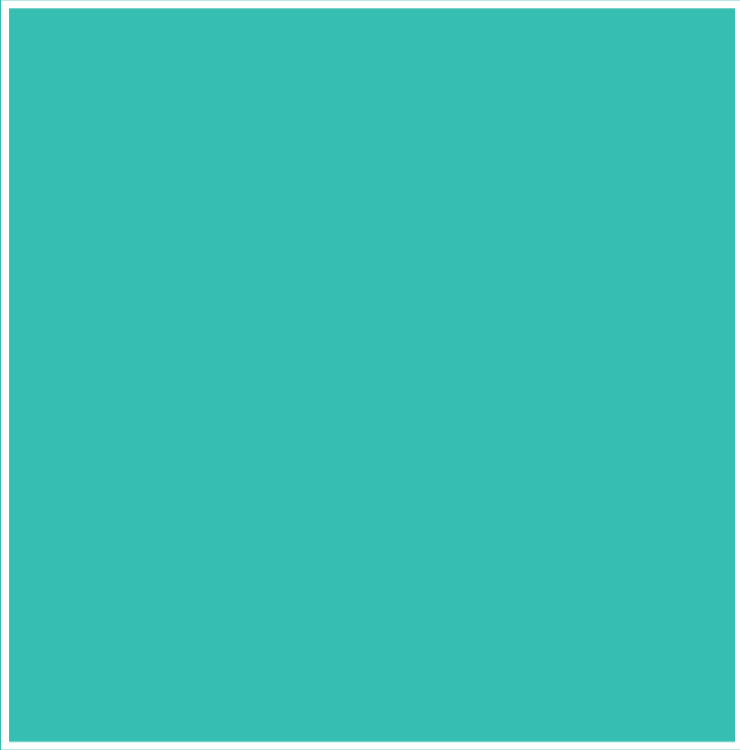
Babies jelly - like eggs

There are a few amphibians which live in water and have gills all of their life.

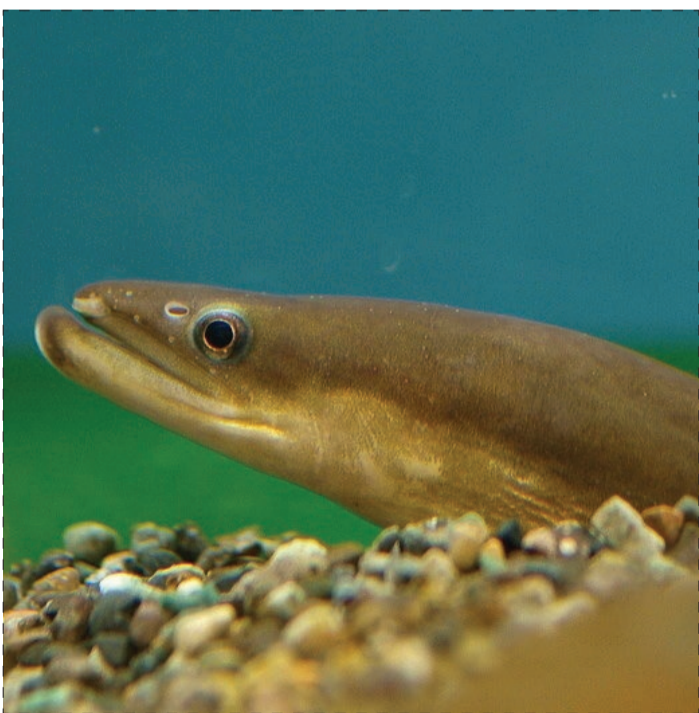
