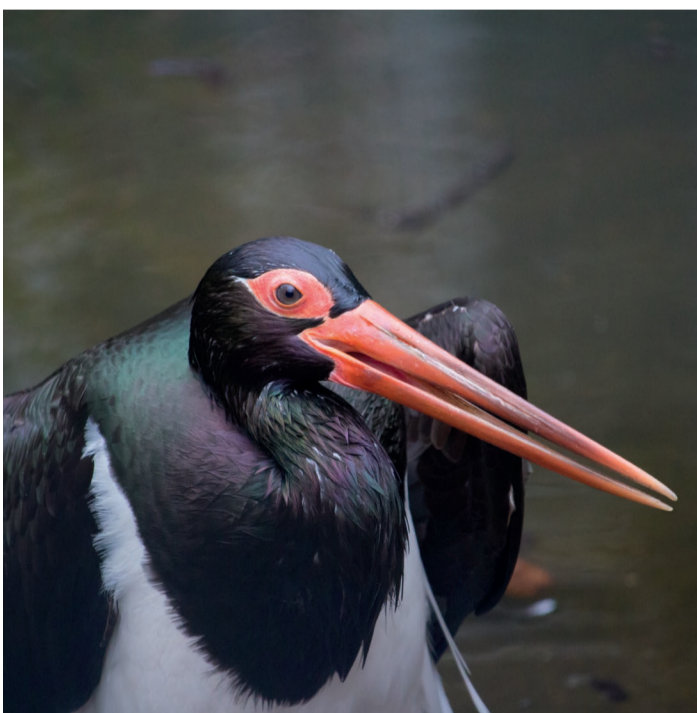
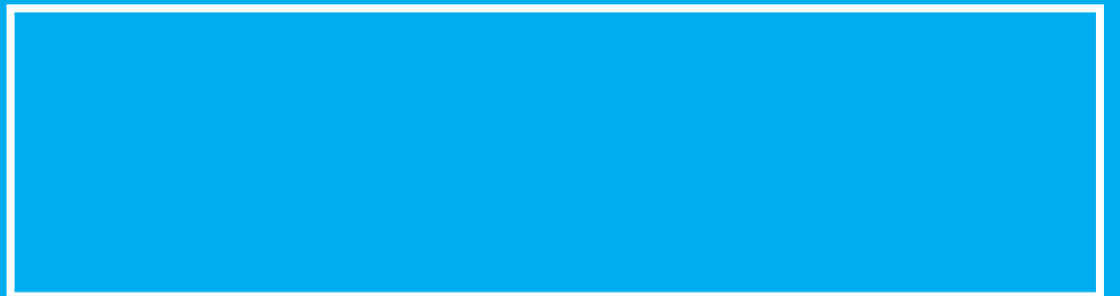
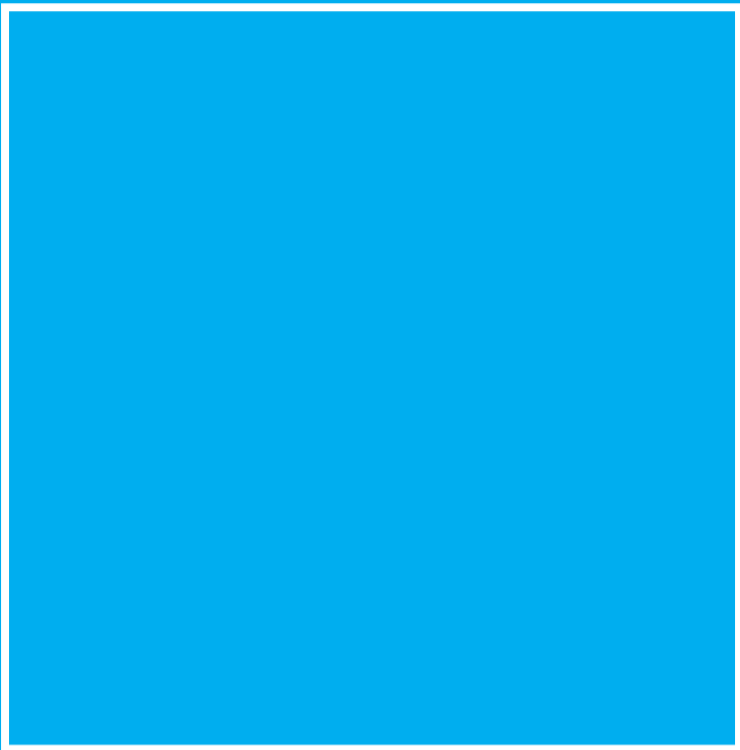
There are 3 egg laying mammals that live in Australia and New Guinea – the platypus, short nosed and long nosed echidna.

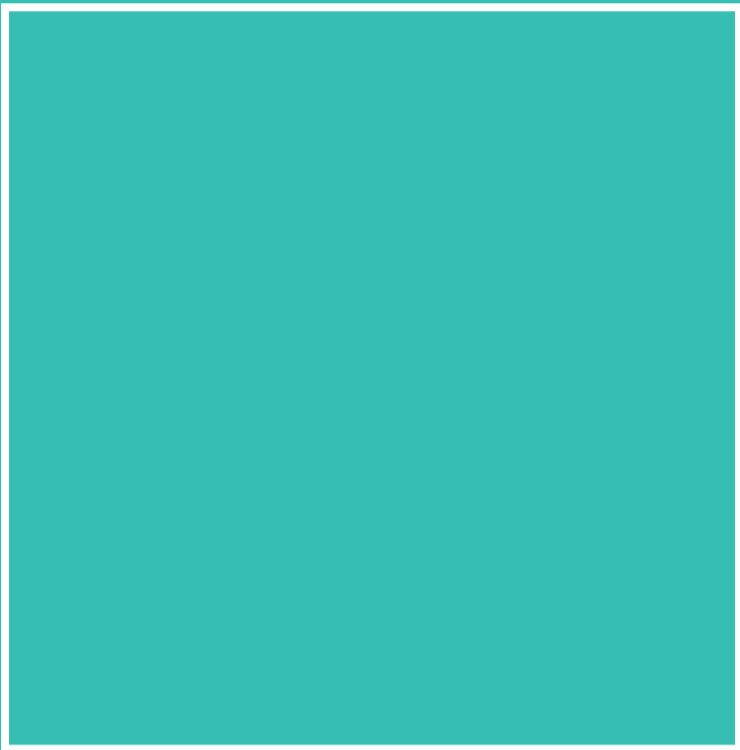
Body Covering	nothing (just plain skin)
